Revelation 11:1-14

I was given a reed like a measuring rod and was told, "Go and measure the temple of God and the altar, and count the worshipers there. ²But exclude the outer court; do not measure it, because it has been given to the Gentiles. They will trample on the holy city for 42 months. ³And I will give power to my two witnesses, and they will prophesy for 1,260 days, clothed in sackcloth." ⁴These are the two olive trees and the two lampstands that stand before the Lord of the earth. 5 If anyone tries to harm them, fire comes from their mouths and devours their enemies. This is how anyone who wants to harm them must die. ⁶These men have power to shut up the sky so that it will not rain during the time they are prophesying; and they have power to turn the waters into blood and to strike the earth with every kind of plague as often as they want. ⁷Now when they have finished their testimony, the beast that comes up from the Abyss will attack them, and overpower and kill them. 8Their bodies will lie in the street of the great city, which is figuratively called Sodom and Egypt, where also their Lord was crucified. 9For three and a half days men from every people, tribe, language and nation will gaze on their bodies and refuse them burial. 10 The inhabitants of the earth will gloat over them and will celebrate by sending each other gifts, because these two prophets had tormented those who live on the earth. 11 But after the three and a half days a breath of life from God entered them, and they stood on their feet, and terror struck those who saw them. ¹²Then they heard a loud voice from heaven saying to them, "Come up here." And they went up to heaven in a cloud, while their enemies looked on. 13At that very hour there was a severe earthquake and a tenth of the city collapsed. Seven thousand people were killed in the earthquake, and the survivors were terrified and gave glory to the God of heaven. ¹⁴The second woe has passed; the third woe is coming soon.

Seven Characteristics Found in the Two Witnesses

- 1. Their sense of duty
 - God has always chosen to do his work through people.
 - The two witnesses will put the judgments of the last part of the tribulation into <u>redemptive context.</u>

2. Their attitude

• The two witnesses wear sackcloth to show their great <u>sorrow</u> over the <u>sinfulness</u> of the unbelieving world.

3. Their empowering

• The preaching of the two witnesses, <u>empowered</u> by the Holy Spirit, will lead to a spiritual <u>revival</u> for Israel.

Zechariah 4:6

So he said to me, "This is the word of the LORD to Zerubbabel: 'Not by might nor by power, but by my Spirit,' says the LORD Almighty.

4. Their <u>power</u>

- The two witnesses will be universally <u>hated.</u>
- They will be <u>unstoppable</u> for the duration of their ministry.
- Your <u>days</u> are held within the framework of God's <u>purpose</u> for you.

5. Their death

- The anti-Christ will be a world leader empowered by Satan.
- The great city of Jerusalem is now seen as a city of unmatched <u>sin</u> and <u>captivity</u>.
- People all around the world will <u>see</u> and <u>celebrate</u> the deaths of the two witnesses.

6. Their <u>resurrection</u>

• The resurrection of the witnesses provides <u>comfort</u> for believers but not yet <u>repentance</u> for <u>unbelievers</u>.

7. Their impact

• As a result of the two witnesses' ministry and resurrection, the final remnant of Jews will come to faith in Christ.

Romans 11:4-5, 26

And what was God's answer to him? "I have reserved for myself even thousand who have not bowed the knee to Baal." ⁵So too, at the present time there is a remnant chosen by grace.

²⁶And so all Israel will be saved, as it is written: "The deliverer will come from Zion; he will turn godlessness away from Jacob.
